


Mosquito season in Dallas County is from from April to November.

Infected mosquitoes can then transmit West Nile Virus to humans and animals.



DEFEND BY USING FOUR Ds



DEET All Day, Every Day Whenever you're outside, use insect repellents that contain DEET or other EPA approved repellents and follow instructions.



Wear long, loose, and light-colored clothing outside.



DRAIN

Remove all standing water in and around your home. Change water in wading pools, pet dishes, and birdbaths several times a week.



DUSK & DAWN

Limit outdoor activities during dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active.
