Traffic Study

The City of Coppell commissioned an independent engineering firm to conduct a Signal Warrant Analysis for the Fallkirk/Denton Tap Intersection. The firm placed traffic strips (automated tube counters) at the intersection from the evening of March 30th until the evening of March 31st, a 24 hour period. They went into great detail and evaluated each of the 9 warrants (requirements) of the Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and determined that no traffic light was needed. The Board feels, however, that there were significant errors in the analysis and that it did not take into account comments made by Coppell Greens residents in their survey responses. We will be writing a detailed rebuttal to their analysis and addressing our concerns to the Coppell Engineering Dept. and Mayor.

The construction of the homes to our north continues as lots are sold. Hopefully the worst of the construction project is now behind us. Houses bordering our north property line will have wood fences and will not have gates to access our greenbelts. When all of the houses are completed, however, there will be gaps in the fence along their retention ponds. If we have a problem with their residents using our greenbelts, the Board will consider building a fence to fill in those gaps. If you see any of their residents using our greenbelts, please let us know. Your dues are going towards irrigating and maintaining our greenbelts. They do not have the right to use them.
