Trash Collection

Placement of Trash & Recycle Receptacles and Bulk Trash—Waste and recycle items cannot be placed out earlier than the evening before the scheduled trash/recycle pickup day and must be removed from the right-of-way by the morning after the scheduled trash/recycle pickup day. Trash and bulk pickup collection takes place every Monday and Thursday and recycle and yard trimmings collection is every Wednesday. Bulk trash items must be stored out of public view until the evening before the collection day.

Republic Services offers once a month free access to the Camelot Landfill site located in Lewisville. Residents also have access to a household hazardous waste (HHW) and electronics disposal service once a month. Best Buy in Lewisville will also accept electronics and batteries for recycle.

Call Republic Services at 972-304-3555 to schedule your HHW pick-up. Stage 1 Water Restrictions

The dog days of summer are here, and the City of Coppell is currently in Stage 1 of the Drought Contingency Plan. Stage 1 is Water Awareness - No outside watering allowed between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm, except for the use of non-spray irrigation systems and hand watering. The use of non-spray irrigation systems and hand watering will be allowed all days, during Stage 1. Did you know the best time to water your lawn is early morning or at dusk when it begins to cool down? Watering in the afternoon can do more harm than good. The water sits on your grass and heats up. By the time it reaches the roots it's so hot it burns the roots, killing your glass and the surrounding biota. Watering in the middle of the day when water quickly evaporates costs more money, and is prohibited by city ordinance. Set your sprinkler to water between 10pm and 5am for best results.



Homeowners may fly the flags of the United States, Texas or a branch of the United States military however there are restrictions to the size, number, and/or location of flags, flag poles and lights used to illuminate flags. ACC approval is required before erecting either a free standing pole or a pole attached to the front of a house. City Code Compliance

The City of Coppell residential parking regulations require that all vehicles, trailers, and boats, etc. be parked on an approved solid concrete surface. Vehicles parked in the driveway cannot extend over the sidewalk path or street. Sidewalk paths

must remain clear for pedestrians. Trailers and boats cannot be parked on the street more than 2 hours in a residential area. Home Based Businesses - Residents who desire to conduct a business at home can do so in the City of Coppell if they follow the zoning regulations. These regulations state that the activity can employ only members of the immediate family who reside in the home, there is no external evidence of the occupation - signs, displays, noise, storage of materials, equipment, traffic, or parking violations and that there is no separate entrance for the business and no appointed visits by the public.
