We've Gone Digital

Like most HOAs, we have finally decided to go digital with our newsletter and dispense with the cost of mailing out hard copies which many people unfortunately don't look at. HOA Board Zoom

There will be a Coppell Greens HOA Board Zoom meeting on Wednesday, 12/20 starting at 6 p.m. A notice with a link to the meeting was sent out to all homeowners.

HOA Dues Increase

You may have noticed on the quarterly bill from SpectrumAM that you received recently that your HOA dues have increased by \$10 to \$185/quarter. We were very reluctant to do so, but really had to in order to keep up with increasing costs. The alternative was to allow our reserves to be depleted. We would then have to levy a special assessment if we had an immediate cost like we had for repairing stone retaining walls back in 2003 & 2004. We really want to avoid special assessments. The HOA dues are now slightly higher than they were 20 years ago. Here is the history:

1/2003: \$720/year

8/2007: reduced to \$660/year 1/2008: reduced to \$600/year 1/2018: increased to \$700/year 12/2023: increased to \$740/year

If you have your HOA dues automatically bank drafted, there is no need to do anything.

Mowing Corner Lots

If you live on a corner lot, it is your responsibility to mow the lawn along the sidewalk at the side of your house. It is not on HOA property and it is not mowed by Thousand Oaks.

Who mows what?

Some homeowners are confused about what they need to mow. In most cases, you can find out simply by turning on your sprinklers. You are required to mow the lawn on your property including the use easement which extends to the side of your neighbor's house and driveway. Police Department Ticketing

The Coppell Police Department has recently started ticketing cars parked in driveways which block the sidewalk. It is a violation of the Coppell City Code and ticketing is at the discretion of the patrolling officers. While we agree that homeowners should not block the sidewalk, the HOA <u>has not</u> contacted the PD about this matter. The fine is \$220.

Also, you are not allowed to park perpendicular to the curb at a cul-de-sac or in front of a fire hydrant. Motor homes, trailers and large delivery trucks are not allowed to be parked either in your driveway (per by-laws) or on the street (per City Code.)

National Night Out

As usual, our National Night Out event was a lot of fun with an inflatable slide for the kids, food, and the PD showing up. Thank you Varadha and those who helped organize it.

Christmas Lights at Entrance

The companies which we have used in the past to install Christmas lights at the entrances increased their price to over \$5,000 which we simply can't afford unless we raise dues even more. We hired someone to install them this year for \$1,700 which did not include wrapping the crepe myrtles with lights. We may decide to have him wrap a few crepe myrtles next year, but really want to control our expenditures so that we don't need to cut back elsewhere.

ACC Requests

If you plan on modifying your home, please make sure to submit an ACC request <u>before</u> you start work. You can do it online through the SpectrumAM.com website. If you have any questions, please send an e-mail to us at: acc@coppellgreens.com. If work is not approved and does not conform to the by-laws and community standards, you may be forced to remove it. That includes changing the style, height, or location of your fence.

Trash & Recycle Bins

The Board has started placing door hangar notices on doors when homeowners leave their trash/recycle bins on the street longer than the day following pickup.

The City of Coppell Code of Ordinances bans the storage of trash cans/recycle bins in your driveway or in front of your house. Bins are required to be placed behind the front line of the house and preferably in the garage or behind a fence where they cannot be seen from the street.

Bins may be placed at the curb for pickup no earlier than 7 p.m. the night before and must be removed no later than 7 a.m the day after pickup. For more information, please see Section 3-5-9 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Coppell.

In addition to making your property look neater, it will help maintain property values in Coppell Greens.
